As a corporation, due to its location on the southernmost-tip of Chester County, the Herr family has spread its corporate and personal philanthropy throughout Chester County, Lancaster County, Maryland and Delaware. Herr Foods can always be counted on to contribute snack foods to any nonprofit that requests so. Furthermore, Herr Foods is the #1 donor in food volume to the Food Bank of Delaware. During 2006, Herr Foods launched a clever marketing and charitable campaign with the release of chips repackaged in "His" bags for Father's Day.
