

GUIDELINES

THE PURPOSE of the Stephan P. Hagelauer Memorial Scholarship is to support educational programs and award scholarships for post-secondary education (2 year/4 year college or university or vocational/technical institute) to a deserving Chester County high school senior whose life has been impacted by Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA). Priority will be given to applicant who has most closely exhibited leadership skills, participated in tennis, community service and has taken French language courses. The Fund will award a one-time, \$1,000 scholarship.

Eligibility

Scholarships will be awarded on a competitive basis to deserving student, who in the judgment of the Stephan P. Hagelauer Scholarship Committee, best meets the noted criteria. Student must be a senior at a Chester County high school with plans to attend post-secondary school the fall semester after graduation from high school.

Essay Format

Please write an essay in response to one of the questions posed on the Student Entry Form. Submissions must be the original, unpublished work of the applicant. Essays must be 300 to 500 words

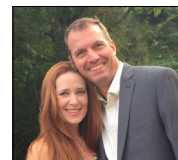

The SPH Memorial Scholarship pays tribute to his French origin and continues Stephan's passion for education and tennis by providing scholarships to graduating seniors pursuing post-secondary education.

Stephan was born in France, growing up mainly in Paris and spending the summers in Corsica. He grew up in a well-known tennis family and his love for the sport was activated at a young age. His early academic life was cultivated by Jesuit brothers where Stephan developed his inquisitive mind and thirst for knowledge. His life experiences and educational accomplishments are vast, receiving his BS in Finance at the Institute Franco-American de Management, followed by an MBA at Central Michigan University in 1994, then his Executive MBA from TRIUM Global eMBA Program (issued by HEC, LSE, NYU) in 2012. In 1999, he met his future American wife, Kelly. Eventually Stephan and Kelly settled in Exton, PA where they celebrated their greatest joys, the arrival of their two precious children.

Stephan was a true leader and had the ability to instill passion and direction in those around him. He brought humor, intellect, a charming French accent and lots of energy to his endeavors both on and off the tennis court. While Stephan is no longer with us do to Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA), his good spirit and fun loving nature continue to touch the many people who had the privilege of knowing him.
