To mark the Community Foundation's 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary, the **Super Door Opener Award** is being bestowed upon two outstanding individuals. **Louis N. Teti, Esq. of West Chester and L. Peter Temple, Esq. of Kennett Square** are being recognized for their **distinguished efforts in opening doors to legacy philanthropy.**
