Brief Mission Statement

The TRF's mission is to rescue ex-racehorses no longer able to compete at the racetrack from neglect, abuse and slaughter. Further, the TRF collaborates with correctional facilities in eight states to provide vocational training to inmates who, in turn, care for horses that are not suitable for second athletic careers. # In brief, what is your proposed use of the grant you are applying for? Include 3-5 goals you wish to achieve with this funding.

The grant funds will be used by the TRF to implement the Second Chances Farm Groom Elite (SCGE) Vocational Program at all TRF Second Chances Programs located at eight farms in seven states. Currently, the curriculum is offered at four of eight farms. In collaboration with correctional facilities, the TRF provides vocational training to inmate students who learn horse care and horse management skills so that they, too, have an opportunity for a Second Chance at life upon release from prison. While providing care to our horses at these facilities, the inmates not only learn vocational skills, but also acquire soft skills including patience, respect and nonverbal communication.

The Elite Groom Program was established by a racehorse owner who believed that her horses would have a better chance of competing effectively and retiring reasonably sound if the people that spent the most time with them, the grooms, were provided with knowledge and skills training that would enable them to more effectively take care of their assigned horses. These Elite Groom education programs are based upon the fact that education is most effective when it is immediately relevant to the person in their day to day life, is dynamic, engages students in multiple methods of learning and is easy to understand. Materials were developed by college professors with over 60 years combined experience in horses, racing and teaching with contributions from veterinarians, farriers, equine dentists and human health and safety professionals. Currently, the TRF offers the SCGE program at four farms, but it is the goal of the TRF to offer the program at all of its Second Chances Programs with the following goals:

- 1. To provide standardized level of education at each of our facilities with every program manager certified in the Groom Elite Program.
- To enhance the level of education and skills that the inmates receive. The SCFE program will provide additional skills and knowledge to the existing foundation of learning already in place at each of our programs.
- 3. To enhance the level of care that the inmates provide our Thoroughbreds located at these correctional facilities.
- 4. To provide a higher skilled individual to meet the demands of the horse industry upon release from prison. These inmates graduate with a certificate from the Elite Groom Program. Gainful employment helps to reduce recidivism at these correctional facilities.

While the cost of the program may vary slightly, it is estimated that the cost to each farm will be roughly \$5,100 to certify the instructor and provide on-going training to the participants. The cost of the program covers the instructor's manuals, teaching aids and travel for an individual from The Groom Elite Program staff to provide independent testing and certification of the graduates. Currently, the TRF is offering the program as funds are available. If fully funded, the TRF would develop a timeline with Dr. C. Reid McLellan, Executive Director of the Groom Elite Program, to schedule the certification and educational coursework. It would be the goal to begin certifying the instructors at the Correctional facility farms within 60-90 days depending on clearance and approval by the respective Departments of Corrections. The TRF's target is to have seven of our eight Second Chances Programs incorporate Groom Elite by the end of a twelve month period with several operational by the end of six months.

List 2 - 3 things that distinguish your organization and why TERF should fund this proposal. As outlined in the TRF's 2019/2020 Strategic Plan, the TRF differentiates itself in three significant ways:

- 1. The TRF's pioneering Second Chances Program described above in unique to this aftercare organization offering these vocational programs for over 35 years.
- 2. THe TRFis one very few aftercare organizations that will accept horses that are not suitable for second athletic careers and offers lifetime sanctuary for horses that have nowhere else to go. For example, in 2019 neglect case involving 50 throughbreds, the TRF took 4 of the worst cases that others would not accept.
- 3. The TRF maintains ownership of the horses for their entire life and will accdept any adopted horse back into its herd at any time. For example, indifficult financial times, we are a safety net for these adopted horses. Recently, the TRF took in a horse that had been adopted out 15 year ago as a result of the passing of the owner with no other family able to care for it.

Space for Additional Information and Notes

The TRF was founded 1983 and since that time has rescued, rehabilitated, adopted and provided sanctuary to thousands of horses. Currently, the TRF cares for almost 550 horses at 14 farms across 9 states. The Second Chances Program was established in 1984 at the Wallkill Correctional Facility and has been the model for other programs. The TRF plans to expand to other facilities as funding becomes available with a goal to place almost all of the TRF horses at these Second Chance facilities. Currently, we have just over 200 horses placed in these programs and most, if not all, of these horses have no opportunity for second careers and little chance of being adopted. With 62% of the TRF herd over the age of 20, we provide a sanctuary for most of these horses and will do so for the rest of their lives.




