GRANT PROPOSAL GUIDELINES

- We connect people who care with causes that matter, so their philanthropy makes a difference now & forever.
- We are a collection of Field of Interest & Donor Advised Funds with @\$3.5M granted annually to nonprofits in Chester County & beyond.
- 99% of our grants are made by our generous Fund Advisors, who make grant decisions all year.

Proposals submitted by nonprofits are considered for 2 types of grants:

Field of Interest & Donor Advised Funds (No Deadline)

- Grants focus on Chester County causes & issues, but are not limited to Chester County.
- Charitable nonprofits working in all fields of interest are considered for grant awards. (I.e. arts, culture, & humanities; education; community improvement; environment; religion; health; & human services)
- General operating grants are encouraged.
 Nonprofits should be specific about their mission, goals, & measurable outcomes.
- ♦ Proposals can be submitted <u>anytime all year</u>.
- Grant decisions are made intermittently all year, as Fund Advisors desire.
- ♦ Grant awards typically range from \$500-\$7,500.

Fund for Chester County Capacity Building Grants (Due 9/15)

- ♦ For eligibility in this grant program, nonprofits must be located in & serve Chester County. NPO's with budgets of \$500,000 or less are given preference.
- The goal of capacity building grantmaking is to strengthen the effectiveness of NPO's serving the Chester County region, in areas including:
 - Mission, Vision & Strategy
 - Governance & Leadership
 - Partnerships & Collaborations
 - Operations & Technology
 - Fundraising, Development & Marketing
- Proposals must be submitted by <u>September 15</u> to be eligible for consideration.
- ♦ Grant awards typically range from \$500-\$5,000, with monies distributed by February.

- Proposals are considered "complete" when CCCF has confirmed receipt of the Grant Proposal Summary Sheet, Narrative & Attachments.
- Proposals are shared electronically and online with Fund Advisors, Donors & Grant Panels.
- Per IRS Regulations, applicants <u>must be</u> charitable, tax exempt organizations with 501(c)(3) certification & cannot be individuals.

Proposal Summary:

Attollo is a college access program. Our goal is to connect students with higher education they might not otherwise have access to. By taking the students on college tours, they have exposure to different environments and different aspects of college life. By paying their application fees on a case-by-case basis, students who are low-income have a chance to apply to colleges that might not have been accessible without our organization.

Attollo serves a wide range of students in the Lancaster community. 62% of our scholars are students of color, and 65% come from low-income backgrounds. We emphasize diversity and inclusion; if a student works hard and has potential, they are included in our program, regardless of race, gender, or socio-economic status.

Attollo operates on a virtuous cycle. Our model of giving is not a 1:1 ratio. When you give to Attollo, you are funding the education and development of a human being; someone who will come back to the Lancaster community to continue making a difference.

Attollo, on a small scale, serves the students of Lancaster County, PA. They are given help with every aspect of their college applications, and they are given access to higher education. In a broad sense, Attollo serves the Lancaster community, and society on a larger scale. We don't know what our students will achieve later in their lives, what contributions to tech, medicine, or the arts they might make. Attollo is giving them the opportunity to live to their fullest potential.

1. Nonprofit's history, goals, key achievements & distinctiveness

Attollo currently has 594 Alumni; 594 students who actively engaged with the opportunities Attollo had to provide. We provide programs that prepare the students for college and life post-graduation. Through reflection and introspection, the students learn to tell their story in an empowering way and become the best versions of themselves. A reflex of excellence is expected from our students and staff; through our leadership development, completing difficult tasks at an exceptional level becomes second nature. At Attollo, our goal is to create a pipeline of diverse leaders that will come back to Lancaster to continue changing the community for the better.

2. Funding request

Description of key initiatives

The students are given college prep through SAT courses, personal statement writing workshops, and application guidance. They are given career readiness preparation through programs like Attollo PreMed, which partners with local doctors to give our students hands on experience in the medical field. We have an Engineering and Code program, which gives the students practical experience in the STEM field. Attollo Startup gives students the opportunity to create a business model and pitch their ideas. Our Art and Design program teaches students how to effectively create art through digital media and opens their eyes to the wide variety of careers in the arts.

Specific needs & issues to be addressed

The average cost for a student to participate in the Attollo Program is \$3,100.00. This cost covers college tours and our specific programs detailed above. The tours and programs give the students experiences they may not otherwise have access to and opens doors for exploration of interests.

• Why it is important to fund this now

Our students are the future leaders of the Pennsylvania community. Our program allows them to reach their fullest potential, and more importantly, we teach them to believe in limitless possibilities for their lives. Attollo is a unique program in Lancaster County, and we need support from foundations like yours to continue our vital work.

• How impact & results will be demonstrated

At Attollo, we believe in recording metrics. We record any statistic we can. We keep record of students' attendance and punctuality to all programs they participate in, their scores before and after our SAT prep program, and their college application and admission statistics.
