**Brief Mission Statement** 

The TRF's Mission is to save Thoroughbred horses no longer able to compete at the racetrack from possible abuse, neglect and slaughter. Further, the TRF collaborates with correctional centers at 9 facilities around the country to provide vocational instruction in equine care and management using its horses as teachers to the inmate students so that they will have a better opportunity for gainful employment upon release. Currently, skilled equine caretakers are in demand and this program fulfills a need within the equine industry as well.

The TRF has received funding in 2021 and 2020 for a total of \$15,000 to fund the certification of several farm managers in the Groom Elite Program. Through this certification, the educational instructors at our Second Chances Programs become qualified to teach, test and certify the student inmates in Equine Care and Management. Upon successful completion, the inmates receive a certificate from Groom Elite that enhances their opportunities for employment. Since the TRF received this funding, we have certified four farm managers and provided the curriculum materials, and we have one new manager who will begin the program shortly.

Please describe your charity's public education/research efforts. In addition to providing vocational training in equine care and management to inmate students, the TRF participates in many activities to educate the public about aftercare and the value of Thoroughbreds beyond their racing days. In early 2021, the TRF opened its new farm in Prospect, Kentucky which houses up to 10 horses who act as ambassadors to the region and beyond. Through a partnership with Horse Country Tours, the TRF hosted almost 800 individuals who came to the farm to meet the horses and learn about Thoroughbreds. In addition, several events were hosted by the TRF that brought hundreds more to the farm to learn about Thoroughbreds. Also, the TRF hosts private tours at its Second Chances Farms in New York, Maryland, Florida and Kentucky. During summer months, the TRF opens a summer farm in Saratoga Springs to allow the public to see and learn about Thoroughbreds. As outlined in the publicity list, The TRF participates in interviews with radio, TV and print materials to promote aftercare. Recently, the TRF was interviewed for an article in the Plaid Horse. This June, the TRF will be joining several other aftercare organizations along with the National Museum of Racing to promote aftercare with an emphasis on sanctuaries. There are several areas where the TRF sets itself apart from other aftercare organizations. As described above, the TRF offers vocational training in equine care and management through its Second Chances Programs now located at nine facilities in seven states.

Unlike most organizations, the TRF makes every effort to track all of its adoptees for the remainder of their lives. In addition, if any horse adopted from the TRF needs a home, the TRF will gladly take the horse back into its herd regardless of how long ago the horse was adopted. Our horses remain TRF horses their entire lives.

Also, the TRF accepts horses that other organizations will not take due to soundness issues or old age. Many organizations focus on retraining and adoption, while the TRF focuses on sanctuary for horses that have reached the end of the first, second and even third careers and need a soft-landing for the remainder of their lives.

### Goals:

The TRF will use awarded funds to purchase educational materials and aids with a goal of enhancing the learning experience for the student inmates. Having achieved our goal of certifying all our Second Chances instructors with the exception of one new instructor, we are now focused on supplying our farms with the aids that will help them convey the information visually or with life-sized models.

Many, if not most, of the participants in these programs have never worked with horses and are often intimidated by these 1,200-pound animals. With the use of models such as head, legs, hocks etc., it will facilitate the learning and fine tune their skills before applying classroom learning to the horse itself. For example, learning to wrap a plastic leg is far less intimidating than learning on a real horse.

Having these new educational items will keep the learning experience more dynamic and fresh for both the students and instructors.



My name is Nicole Purdom, and I am a graduate of the TRF second chances program. As an individual who benefitted from funding, like the grant you provide, it is imperative that you know the impact this has had on my life.

I had no previous horse experience prior to the program. As this was not uncommon, the books, diagrams, and other visual aids were exceedingly helpful to me. As a matter of fact, a book on Equine safety set the tone for my journey through the program. I was not allowed to interact with the horses until! understood that safety was of the utmost importance.

Our curriculum in the program was designed so that each chapter or lesson built upon the previous one. Our main textbook was all encompassing. It started with the origin of Equus and covered areas such as anatomy, pasture maintenance and rotation, worming schedules, feed and nutrition, management skills...the list goes on. Here are a few examples of how specific learning aids directly contributed to my success in the Equine industry.

I am a visual, "hands on" learner. Therefore, aids like a plastic horse leg gave me practical experience in properly placing standing bandages and polos. This enabled me to confidently apply this knowledge on our retired racehorses without fear of injuring them with a bandage bow.

Another example is having an actual saddle to identify its parts and bridles to disassemble and reassemble. I learned this was crucial for a rider inspecting their tack before training or a simple hack.

Moreover, educational videos such as the one on conformation, illustrated how a balanced horse must have the right angle to their shoulder, slope to their pasterns, a nice topline, and a well-defined hip. This allowed us to go into the barn and apply what we had just watched. It was the practical application of these lessons that allowed me to thrive in the industry.

Upon my release, over eight years ago, I was hired as a groom for a very well known and respected farm. My duties included stall cleaning, grooming, hot walking, and of course, applying bandages.

The following season, I was given the opportunity to become an exercise rider, I have been an exercise rider for seven years now. I have done everything from breaking young horses to breezing horses at the in-training sales. Those accomplishments alone would not have been possible if it weren't for books on riding and retired thoroughbreds to practice on.

Finally, last year, I was given an opportunity to purchase horses for a client. My knowledge of horse conformation was essential in that endeavor and having that knowledge gave me the confidence to do the job successfully.

As you can see, you aren't just providing money for learning aids. It is so much more than that! You provide direction, which paves the way for opportunity, and with that comes the realization of hope. Hope for a second chance.
