



Dr. Dolly Wideman-Scott is a visionary, community mobilizer, public speaker, and exceptional advocate and has been the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Domestic Violence Center of Chester County, PA (DVCCC) since 1996. DVCCC is a non-profit organization that provides trauma informed programs and services for victim survivors of domestic violence, intimate partner violence and stalking and services for their dependent children. DVCCC also provides public education and training on the cycle of relationship violence and risk assessments (LAP). Wideman-Scott's multi-faceted experience include working with constituent groups including boards, committees, volunteers, communities of faith and the public.

Dr. Wideman-Scott has more than 40 years of experience in the field of domestic violence and serves on a number of county-wide, state and national coordinating bodies – she is on the Governance Board of the Chester County Partnership to End Homelessness, the past Diversity Chair and now Nominating Committee Chair for the Pennsylvania Coalition Against Domestic Violence and she also served on the Board as Vice-President for the National Resource Center on Domestic Violence ; and she is a Pennsylvania Association of Nonprofit Organizations (PANO) Standards for Excellence Board Member and licensed consultant. With Dr. Wideman-Scott's Leadership, DVCCC is a Pennsylvania Association of Nonprofit Organization (PANO) accredited organization. She is an Exton Region Chamber of Commerce Member. Dr. Wideman-Scott is also on a Faith based board that provides resources to communities in need.
