


MEDICAL RACISM — The systematic and wide-spread racism against people of color within the medical system. It includes the inequity in our society that causes marginalized people to be less healthy, the disparity in access to health care based on race, and the conscious and unconscious biases held by healthcare workers who provide care to people of color.

RESPECTFUL CARE — Care provided to patients in a manner that maintains their dignity, privacy and confidentiality, ensures freedom from harm and mistreatment, and enables informed personal choice and agency over health care decisions.



DISCRIMINATION IN HEALTHCARE: Experience

PATIENT EXPERIENCE: Research found that 1 in 5 Black and Hispanic adults report they were personally **treated unfairly because of their race or ethnicity** while getting health care in the past year, with a higher share of Black mothers reporting unfair treatment.








DISCRIMINATION IN HEALTHCARE: Experience

Breast Feeding: Intention and Success



Feelings

"so many traumas being black & pregnant. More support when you do seek care (listening)"

"feel alone in the process, intimidating"

Logistics

"Insurance takes over a month to get a breast pump" "I had my baby on Friday a.m., discharged on Saturday. The nurses during the evening were rushed. One seemed like she had an attitude "gasping."

Preparation and Encouragement

"It's been a whole 9 months without being open to breastfeeding options."

"More MOTIVATION TO DO IT. Be transparent. No empowerment"

"LET Them know the importance"






DISCRIMINATION IN HEALTHCARE: Outcomes

PATIENT OUTCOMES

- Maternal death rates increased during COVID-19 and racial disparities widened for women of color.
- Pregnancy-related mortality rates among Black women are more than twice the rate of White or Hispanic women.


