GRANT PROPOSAL GUIDELINES

- The Chester County Community Foundation connects people who care with the causes that matter, so their philanthropy makes a difference now & forever.
- We are a collection of Field of Interest & Donor Advised Funds with \$5M + granted annually to nonprofits in Chester County & beyond.
- 99% of our grants are made by our generous Fund Advisors, who make grant decisions all year.

Proposals submitted by nonprofits are considered for 2 types of grants:

Field of Interest & Donor Advised Funds (No Deadline)

- Grants focus on Chester County causes & issues, but are not limited to Chester County.
- Charitable nonprofits working in all fields of interest are considered for grant awards. (I.e. arts, culture, & humanities; education; community improvement; environment; religion; health; & human services)
- General operating grants are encouraged.
 Nonprofits should be specific about their mission, goals, & measurable outcomes.
- ♦ Proposals can be submitted <u>anytime all year</u>.
- Grant decisions are made intermittently all year, as Fund Advisors desire.
- ♦ Grant awards typically range from \$500-\$7,500.

Fund for Chester County Capacity Building Grants (Due 9/13)

- ♦ For eligibility in this grant program, nonprofits must be located in & serve Chester County.
- Nonprofits **budgets** must be **\$500,000 or less.**
- The goal of capacity building grants is to strengthen the effectiveness of NPO's serving the region, see page 4 for more details on the areas including:
 - Mission, Vision & Strategy
 - o Governance & Leadership
 - Partnerships & Collaborations
 - Operations & Technology
 - Fundraising, Development & Marketing
- Proposals submitted between <u>July 1 Sept. 13</u> are eligible for consideration.
- ♦ Grant awards typically range from \$500-\$5,000, with monies distributed by February.

- Proposals are considered "complete" when CCCF has confirmed receipt of the Grant Proposal Summary Sheet, Narrative & Attachments.
- Proposals are shared electronically and online with Fund Advisors, Donors & Grant Panels.
- Per IRS Regulations, applicants <u>must be</u> charitable, tax exempt organizations with 501(c)(3) certification & cannot be individuals.

The Unionville Community Fair, Inc. has been going on strong for 99 years, this being our 99th.

Our goal is to encourage the State of Pennsylvania's largest source of revenue (agriculture) among the generations of people in our community and the promotion and education of Agriculture, Agribusiness, Homemaking, Handcrafts and the Arts. On our last report we got a 3 instead of a 4 on entertainment.(I have attached the visitation form from last year.) So therefore, entertainment is part of what the state wants us to have to make our fair official.
- Why it is important to fund this now: Having Wonderzone Dinosaur zoo at the fair will not only educate in STEM, but also will attract large numbers to the fair all the days the fair will be there. Since we are a part of the PA State Fair Association, we need to show entertainment as part of our fair, and we are looking to be graded high in this area this year.
- How impact & results will be demonstrated: Number of fairgoers can be measured by how many go in the front entrance gate. Dinosaur zoo is our main attraction, so he will be sure to be seen by all. Field trips' teachers will see improvement in children's science studies, as this year it will coincide directly with their dinosaur studies. It will also be stimulating to the older seniors we are having come to the fair for a special senior event. We also need
