Nonprofit's history, goals, key achievements & distinctiveness

Bridge of Hope was founded in Chester County, and has been ending family homelessness for more than 30 years locally and nation-wide since 2002. The Bridge of Hope model is a unique solution to family homelessness that differs from the traditional shelter or transitional housing program. We work collaboratively to help families move into safe and sustainable housing, and achieve long-term stability by providing comprehensive post-shelter and Whole Family Case Management services for 12-18 months. Rental assistance is also provided on average for 6-8 months on a decreasing basis to coordinate with education or job training opportunities, which helps families begin working on financial goals. Families are accepted into the program regardless of race, ethnicity, faith or past experiences.

The Bridge of Hope model includes a distinctive component called Neighboring. Neighboring is provided for each family by a group of 6-10 trained volunteers from a local Christian church/group who build intentional relationships of support. Neighboring Volunteers walk alongside the family facing homelessness providing tangible and emotional support; such as emergency childcare, help to find housing and move in, networking through their social connections, a ride if transportation breaks down, encouragement and friendship. Data continues to show that support systems are critical for ending family homelessness in every community. (Bassuk, 2015, Services Matter: How housing and services can end family homelessness.)

The Bridge of Hope network includes 24 Bridge of Hope locations across the country. Bridge of Hope Chester County is an affiliate which operates under the umbrella of Bridge of Hope Inc. (i.e. Bridge of Hope National), along with Bridge of Hope Lancater. All other affiliates operate independently. Bridge of Hope National's board is the governing board and Bridge of Hope Chester County also has a "community board" that oversees programming, serves as ambassadors and fundraisers in the community.

Family homelessness has been increasing due to the skyrocketing cost of housing combined with inflation and residual impacts from the pandemic. We experienced a 284% increase in calls for help this past year. Bridge of Hope Chester County ended homelessness for 15 families (50 parents and children) in FY 2022-23, which was 36% more than were served the previous year. Our goal for FY 2023-24 is to serve at least 18 families by March 31, 2024, the end of our fiscal year, and we are well on our way to meeting that goal to help meet the critical need in Chester County for services that end the cycle of homelessness.

Funding request

We are requesting a grant of \$4,960 to fund the purchase of a Microsoft cloud storage subscription. We are currently using a Microsoft small business server that will be outdated and no longer supported by Microsoft as of October 1, 2023. We can use our current server for a few more months but we must either purchase a new server or move to a cloud-based subscription. Based on recommendations from the industry and our IT provider, we would like to move to a server-less environment. Additionally, a cloud based storage option offers benefits for remote work, and it is less expensive than the traditional server.

Bridge of Hope Chester County employees work a hybrid schedule with some days in the office and some from home and conducting home-based visits with families in Bridge of Hope. This new system will relieve us of the cumbersome and unreliable use a virtual private network (VPN) to access files remotely.

We use an external IT contractor and they have recommended the Microsoft cloud storage as the best option for our organization's needs. When an on-premises server is at capacity, new equipment and resources must be added to expand its capacity. Preferably, cloud storage can be scaled based on certain metrics as needed using its built-in features. It is also more secure and reliable.

It is important to fund this project now because our current technology is outdated and we need to make the move to a new system in early 2024.

While not often talked about, IT infrastructure is critical to our work ending family homelessness. Staff must be able to save, locate and share important information, addresses, documents, and photos. Having access to files while they are on the road and with clients is crucial to productivity.

Impact will be measured through the following markers:

- Ability for staff to share documents and access resources among each other as a team
- Assurance that data will not be lost through fire, flood, etc. since data will now be in the cloud
- Assurance of a secure system for remote access when off site.

We received an estimate for the costs in November 2022 from our IT contractor (full detailed proposal provided in attachments):

Initial costs

Veeam Backup appliance \$ 499 Labor \$5,687 Total \$6,186

Annual Recurring Charges \$8,694 Total for first year = \$ 14,880

To best utilize economies of scale, this system will be used by Bridge of Hope National and the two local affiliates in Lancaster and Chester County. We respectfully request a grant of \$4,960 for funding one-third of the migration and cost of the first year subscription cost for a cloud based file storage system.
