






2023 Look Back & 2024 Look Forward

Fund Highlight Brother Moon & Sister Sun Fund Est. 2023 John R. Twombly Jr. Esq., Door Opener


There is a Korean folktale in which siblings face a dangerous situation together and ultimately sacrifice for each other's well-being.

Growing up, Asa enjoyed karate, art, skateboarding and climbing anything he could find. As a pursued many artistic endeavors. After graduating from Hill Top Preparatory School in 2014, after a series of varied and interesting jobs. As a finally settled on private finance. He was very happily studying economics and investing his portfolio in crypto, watches, cars, stocks, gold and unique commodities.

Asa's journey was not met without challenge. Asa faced tiger-like adversity due to autism. As a never let his diagnosis define him. Despite facing difficulties forming connections, he sustained many meaningful friendships and exhibited remarkable courage and persistence.

As a liked to drive and he knew most everything about cars. Tragically, on October 16, 2022 at the age of 27, Asa's life was cut short by a motorcycle accident.

As the grief-stricken Brenneman family met with their attorney, John R. Twombly Jr. Esq. of Kennett Square, they expressed their desire to honor Asa's legacy.

After an introductory meeting, the Brenneman family signed a fund agreement with the Community Foundation. In consideration of the core values defining Asa's life, they name their charitable fund the Brother Moon & Sister Sun Fund.

Reflecting Asa's concern for food insecurity, homelessness, education, and developmental needs, the Brother Moon & Sister Sun Fund supports these pressing issues.



Brian C. Zwaan was a loving father, devoted husband, philanthropic pioneer, and generous education advocate. He enjoyed golf, bike riding, church, playing practical jokes, and spending time with family and friends. Brian was passionate about education for all and building community in the Greater Philadelphia Area.

A dedicated family man, Brian was also passionate about his career and his Chester County community. Brian lost his father at a young age, a devastating loss to his entire family. Upon reflection, Brian realized it was the local community education programs that helped him persevere and grow into a successful businessman. That realization created a drive in Brian towards a life of giving back, specifically focused on the power of education and accessibility.


Brian's impact can be felt at many schools throughout Chester County. He served as a board member and champion donor, advancing local educational programs. His legacy touched Villa Maria Academy, Malvern Preparatory School, Archbishop John Carroll High School, and Cardinal John Foley School, to name a few.

Alongside his philanthropy, Brian was also known as a prominent banker in the Philadelphia region. He co-founded Penn Liberty Bank and served as President until 2016. Even after the acquisition by WSFS, Brian remained on the team as Vice President and Director of Commercial Banking.

Brian loved being an active member of his community and working in the finance industry, but his most prized role was loving husband to his wife, Diane, and father to their four children, Elizabeth, Matthew, Sarah, and Margaret. Brian shared with Diane how he came to love educational community programs and he and Diane wanted to share that passion with their children.

In 2017, Brian died suddenly in a tragic swimming accident at his beloved vacation destination, Sea Isle City, NJ. Amidst their pain, the Zwaan family searched for ways to commemorate Brian. They decided the best way to honor Brian's legacy was to create the Brian C. Zwaan Legacy Fund at the Community Foundation. The family designed this fund so that Brian's commitment to education would live on in perpetuity.

Diane will always remember her husband's enormous capability to love. "Brian's energy, commitment and passion was boundless. We miss him immensely. It is my passion to ensure his legacy lives on through the Brian C. Zwaan Legacy Fund."



As Brian loved to golf, the Brian C. Zwaan Legacy Fund Golf Classic served as a way to gather in Brian's honor, spend a terrific day outdoors with family and friends, and increase contributions to Brian's legacy fund. After five years, the family held their 5th and final golf tournament in 2023.

The 2023 grants have been awarded to regional nonprofits that support education: All Abilities Foundation of Greater Philadelphia, Archbishop John Carroll High School, Garage Community and Youth Center, Hope Partnership for Education & Brian C. Zwaan Scholarship Fund at Villa Maria Academy High School. The family will continue to make grant decisions annually, gathering to share memories of what Brian cared about most, and to determine how new grant awards will make a difference in these changing times.

Elizabeth Zwaan Milne, Esq., Brian's daughter and a fund advisor, explains, "My father was a role model. His passion and dedication were instilled in me from a young age. I bring those same values to the table as I grow my own family, continue in my own career, serve my community, and oversee his legacy fund."

Brian Zwaan knew that children learn what they live. Brian's legacy continues, in so many, many ways. Well done, Brian, **Now & Forever**.
