
Defining Key Terms

Food Insecurity: A household that is without reliable access to a sufficient quantity of affordable, nutritious, and culturally appropriate food at any given time

Hunger: A personal, physical sensation of discomfort caused by insufficient food to meet basic nutritional needs for a sustained period

Key elements of food security include:

- 1. Availability
- 2. Access
- 3. Utilization/Consumption





What Does Food Insecurity In PA Look Like?

In Pennsylvania, 1,136,400 people are facing hunger - and of them 347,720 are children.

1 in 11 people



face hunger.

1 in 8 children

People facing hunger in

Why Is There Food Insecurity In ChesCo?



High Cost of Living

Rent, utilities, health care, prescriptions, rising food costs

Sudden Life Events

Health crisis, disability, loss of work

Food Insecurity in Chester County

Transportation

Unreliable or lack of vehicles, vehicle sharing or public transportation

Childcare

Lack of consistent or affordable child care





Food Demand & Cost Are Up



"Food demand is up and so is the cost of providing it."

How Does The Chester County Food Bank Combat Food Insecurity?



The **Department of Community Food Access and Education** programs work to empower adults, children and families to participate in their local food system by giving them the space to choose, grow, cook and learn about fresh, healthy foods.

Eat Fresh Cooking and Wellness Classes provide education and resources to increase food literacy, promote a sense of well being and build community engagement and trust around food.

Raised Bed Gardens and Garden Education

increases availability of fresh produce for food insecure households by supporting garden installations, provide education and resources on growing food and fosters community around food and gardening.

Fresh2You Mobile Market makes select stops throughout Chester County selling local, seasonal fruits and vegetables at affordable prices. We also accept SNAP, WIC & Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program checks and other incentives!





Taste It Food Demonstrations and Recipes provide the opportunity to try new things and encouragement to make healthy recipes at home.

Fruit & Vegetable Prescriptions (FVRx) are offered through health care partners throughout the County and can be redeemed at Fresh2You Mobile Market for fresh fruits and vegetables.



Advocate to End Hunger: How You Can Help





Call your lawmakers

Simply picking up the phone to share your thoughts/concerns go a long way.



Email

Send a message showing your support for programs that help combat food insecurity.



Visit a town hall

Show up and speak directly to your lawmaker about programs needed to fight food insecurity.





Some Programs To Advocate For



SNAP

• Formally known as Food Stamps – provides supplemental income to assist families to purchase food. Advocate to protect SNAP, expand SNAP, and increase income thresholds.

Affordable Housing

 A main root cause of food insecurity in housing affordability. Advocate for more affordable housing projects.

Transportation

• Ensure residents are able to get to work, grocery stores, and medical care.

FMNP

 Protect and Expand the Farmers Market Nutritional Program – provides checks to seniors to be used at local farmer markets for access to fresh fruits and vegetables. Advocate to expand the benefit.

TED TALK

- Leslie Campbell worked at FoodShare Toronto during this 2021 TEDTalk. He now serves as Policy Development Officer of Food Strategy for the City of Toronto.
- As a student, Leslie spent a year in Northern Thailand managing an organic farm and developing an agricultural training curriculum.
 This inspired him to pursue a Master's degree in Geography focusing on the social/ecological aspects of food systems.
- He returned overseas for four years, teaching agriculture in Indonesia, then agricultural research/training in Ethiopia.
- Leslie supports community-led food access initiatives, research and advocacy. He broadens conversations about food insecurity to include discussions of the many systems of oppression that hold it in place. In his talk, he emphasizes the important relationship between food insecurity and structural racism.
- He believes strongly in income-based solutions to food insecurity as implemented alongside universally accessible public services, and in the need for those most impacted by these issues to lead the solution-finding process.
- He details the importance of government action, and the steps that everyone can take to help alleviate food insecurity.
