QUESTION #1 (Brief mission statement and describe the distinguishing features of your organization that supports the mission of TERF and the relevance to this proposal.)

At the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, we believe dignity and compassion are the foundations of lives well-lived. We provide a lifetime sanctuary for Thoroughbreds after their racing careers as well as opportunities for people wishing to improve their well-being through the undeniable healing power of horses. The TRF supports Thoroughbred health & welfare through its sanctuary farms. Our Second Chances farms are used as vocational training for approved incarcerated individuals at eight correctional facilities throughout the country. The hands-on skills developed by these inmates can then be used for post-release work opportunities and career development. The life skills gleaned through contact with retired racehorses can also be used to avoid recidivism.

QUESTION #2 (Briefly outline 3-5 goals for the requested funds and how these goals support your mission.)

- 1. Farm Managers Conference
 - a. Allow farm managers and vocational instructors the opportunity to collaborate, share experiences and problem solve. There aren't many farm managers who care for only rescued or retired and aging thoroughbreds. There also aren't many farm managers who care for this herd population AND do it with incarcerated individuals while navigating complex prison systems that vary from state to state and facility to facility.
 - b. Share the educational components of different curriculums and how each portion is implemented to teach different groups of individuals who usually don't have experience with horses.
 - c. Provide an opportunity to engage with others to create a supportive and collaborative network of managers who can use each other as a resource.
 - d. Provide training to all farm managers on issues of particular interest to the TRF. Examples include pasture management and rotational grazing, care of the aging equine, review of standard operating procedures for equine care and farm management, administrative and personnel policies and best practices.
- 2. Full Equine Skeleton for Central Maryland Correctional Facility.
 - a. Through our TRF Second Chances Programs, our goal is to educate and teach incarcerated individuals about the horse, and how to best care for the aging equine. Many of the men, women and youth in our programs are learning through hands on experiences and visual aids. We have extremely promising feedback from the addition of a full equine skeleton at the Wallkill Correctional Facility in New York (see attached photo). It has been a game changer for the men to see how a horse is truly put together, learn how their injuries affect their movement and well-being, and see how a horse is truly a complicated creature (inside and out, just as people are).

b. We ask T.E.R.F. for a full equine skeleton for the Central Maryland Correctional Facility in Sykesville, MD as this program has truly pushed the envelope on skills learning and employment. Currently, we have a graduate who has not only worked at Laurel Park but worked his way up to Assistant Trainer. The men here have in-depth, hands-on experience with our horses and in addition the facility is our only program to allow fully public Open Barns. Here, this would not only teach our students, but all the children, youth and families who visit. We have been blown away by the 400+ people who attended the Fall Open Barn, and we expect as many if not more this Spring. Central Maryland has become a model for other TRF Second Chances Programs in this regard, and we want to work to further enhance the learning and opportunities here. We are also very grateful for an immensely supportive Department of Corrections at this location.

3. Historical Education Posters

- a. Print quality posters reflecting the history of the Second Chances program at Wallkill Correctional Facility that can also be used for educational purposes.
- b. Our Second Chances program at Wallkill is celebrating its 40th anniversary this year. We would like to document this ground-breaking history so it can be taught to the inmates in this vocational program. We also would use the posters to educate visitors and donors about the program, which would allow us to continue its cycle of funding.
- c. Our Second Chances Program provides an invaluable opportunity for prisoners who want to improve their lives, both while incarcerated and upon release. The therapeutic value of horses and the life skills they impart go a long way in making a sentence more bearable. These same qualities can also be used when an individual is ready to start a new life and improve their well-being.

QUESTION #3 (Provide a detailed description of the proposed project, how it is related to the mission of TERF and how it will impact the health and welfare of the horse.)

1. Farm Managers Conference

- a. The TRF operates 15 farms, both sanctuary programs and Second Chances programs, in 8 states across the country. Due to geographic and time zone constraints, group communication is extremely limited with most interactions occurring between individual farm managers and the Director of Equine Programs and/or the National Herd Manager. We still have several new vocational instructors, so gathering again in 2024 to share challenges, problem solve and build relationships would contribute to the solidification of the groundwork that was laid in our 2023 Farm Managers Conference. In addition, it is an opportunity to share and review all of the TRF's standard operating procedures and best practices regarding horse care, farm management and personal and administrative policies.
- b. This year's conference is scheduled for October 15th-17th in Saratoga Springs, NY. Some of the topics we intend to cover are care and feeding of aging equines, pasture

management and rotational grazing, review of best practice and SOPs, and the role of individual horsemanship in a herd environment. The presenters have not yet been chosen, but we are hoping for an equine vet, a feed company rep who specializes in feeding the aging equine and the former Equine Director of the Global Federation of Animal Sanctuaries.


2. Full Equine Skeleton

- **a.** The skeleton will be purchased from Walter Varcoe, articulated equine skeleton specialist (www.equineskeletons.com). Mr. Varcoe created a similar skeleton for the TRF that is used at the Wallkill Correctional Facility (see attached photo).
- **b.** A full equine skeleton will be invaluable in teaching the incarcerated students who wish to make horses part of their lives upon release. It is a visual aid second to none when combined with the living, breathing creature who lives in a stall down the shedrow.
- c. The Central Maryland Correctional Facility has a very good relationship with its surrounding community, as evidenced by the large crowd who attended their Open Barn in 2023. A full equine skeleton will engage young and old and teach them about the horses themselves and offer a bridge between the incarcerated individuals and their community.

3. Historical Education Posters

HISTORY

Rewind history to the 1920's.... Ending with a bang in 1929 was the flappers, bootlegging era of Scarface Al Capone and swiftly followed by a stock market crash. Throughout the 20's the number of incarcerated individuals was rising, leading to the increased legislature which stiffened penalties for repeat offenders including mandatory life sentence for a fourth felony conviction.

Prison escape attempts, vandalism and fires pushed Legislature to create a Commission to Investigate Prison Administration and Constructio, chaired by Sam Lewisohn. In the 1930 report by the Lewisohn Commission, it was recommended that a program stressing rehabilitation and construction of a reduced security institution for men.


Great Meadow Correctional Facility, today a maximum security facility, began as a place for first time offenders. But as prison numbers were climbing, a wall was bulit around this, and more individuals housed there.

For another try at a "prison without walls" New York purchased a large tract of land in Ulster County. The original 950 acre site included farmland with a picturesque view of the Shawangunk Mountain Ridge.



Then Governor Franklin D. Roosevelt attended the openings of Wallkill in 1932 and later that year won election to his first term as President.


Designing this facility would be reknowned architect Alfred Hopkins- who submitted a design of interconnected Gothic buildings of gray stone, with steeply slopd roofs massive oak doors and an enclosed courtyard in the centrer overlooked by cathedral windows. Wallkill was intended as a prison where individuals were sent for eductions.

They insisted on education programs for the guards as well, and in 1936 Wallkill became the site for the nation's f

The Lewisohn Commission also recommended the New York "should develop a prison system which will protect society from the criminal and his evil deeds by endeavoring to reeducate and retrain these men and women."

"Mass treatment," the Commission said, should be replaced by "a system of ... individual treatment and training." The Commission intended that Wallkill would be "manned by high-grade personnel to afford specialized training adapted to the need of individual prisoners."

It should also receive the best prospects: men, said Commissioner of Correction Dr. Walter N. Thayer, Jr., "whom we feel will be receptive to the program we are endeavoring to set up there - a training and rehabilitative program."

In 1935, legislation was enacted creating the position of Director of Education for the Correction Department. The first appointee to this position was Walter M. Wallack, Ed. D., a product of Columbia University Teachers College who had served as educational advisor to the Lewisohn Commission.

The new, statewide emphasis on education would be most filly realized at Wallkill. Aided by a grant from the Carnegie Corporation and assisted by the Curriculum Laboratory of Columbia Teachers College, a two-track academic course was developed. It was geared specifically for adult prisoners, leading to either a Regents diploma or high school general equivalency. The vocational curriculum offered training in 24 trades, with formal tie-ins to the academic side as well as planned coordination with the facility maintenance department for on-the job training.

The New York State prison system had its beginnings in 1797 with a single prison called Newgate located

in New York City. A second state prison opened 20 years later in Auburn in 1817, and in 1825 a group of

Auburn prisoners made the voyage across the Erie Canal and down the Hudson River to begin building Sing Sing

The state commissioned architect
Alfred Hopkins to design three major
institutions built between 1933
and 1935: Wallkill Correctional Facility,
Woodbourne Correctional Facility and
Coxsackie Correctional
Facility. All three were designed on
progressive principles, reflected a
concern for aesthetics and a sense
of place, and had no surrounding walls
or fences.

In the 1940's, chapels were built in the attics of two of the housing wings. St. Peter's Protestant Chapel was dedicated in 1944 and the Catholic Chapel in 1948. Eac was funded by private donations and built by inmate labor. The Protestant Chapel was destroyed by fire in 1986, but was soon reconstructed in the same English Gothic style matching the prison exterior.

To Whom it May Concern,

I had the privilege of helping to spearhead the 2023 TRF Farm Managers Conference- made possible by a generous donation from T.E.R.F. This conference brought together the most amazing people with an extremely unique job title: Farm Manager and Vocational Instructor at Correctional Facilities. This atmosphere has created some of the most rewarding and challenging endeavors in horse care, and without our most incredible managers the mission of "Saving Horses, Changing Lives" would not be possible. To bring them all together from across the country into one room was also a game changer- as time zones, schedules and farm duties have posed challenges to bringing everyone closer together. Meeting face-to-face has created lasting working relationships, and the ability to discuss challenges working for the Department of Corrections and also running large farm operations. All of our farm managers come from widely different backgrounds, which when brought together has also helped create additional learning and ability to brainstorm.

With this grant, we ask for T.E.R.F.'s assistance in bringing these people together for a TRF Farm Managers Conference. The impact is felt more widely than we'll know, as each person affects the people in their respective programs, horses in their care and also the overreaching atmosphere at their hometown correctional facilities. Time and again, we have heard that having the horses at the facilities gives the men, women and youth something positive to look forward and also call home about. Since the 2023 conference I have seen managers connect about how to run Open Barns, DOC protocols, and how to help the students post-release. While each farm is very different, the Dept. of Corrections all have their own difficulties to overcome, stressors beyond the barn, and in addition teaching those who are at the hardest part of their lives. It was wonderful to hear them share stories that they also may not have felt comfortable sharing with those who don't work in the DOC, and for others to understand and brainstorm how to bring new students into the programs.

Thanks to the support and opportunities provided by our program, he has not only found a job but has also chosen a positive path away from drugs and the streets.

These meetings foster a sense of community among equine professionals, providing a platform for knowledge sharing, collaboration, and personal growth.
