# GRANT PROPOSAL GUIDELINES

- The Chester County Community Foundation connects people who care with the causes that matter, so their philanthropy makes a difference now & forever.
- We are a collection of Field of Interest & Donor Advised Funds with \$5M + granted annually to nonprofits in Chester County & beyond.
- 99% of our grants are made by our generous Fund Advisors, who make grant decisions all year.

## Proposals submitted by nonprofits are considered for 2 types of grants:

## Field of Interest & Donor Advised Funds (No Deadline)

- Grants focus on Chester County causes & issues, but are not limited to Chester County.
- Charitable nonprofits working in all fields of interest are considered for grant awards. (I.e. arts, culture, & humanities; education; community improvement; environment; religion; health; & human services)
- General operating grants are encouraged.
   Nonprofits should be specific about their mission, goals, & measurable outcomes.
- ♦ Proposals can be submitted <u>anytime all year</u>.
- Grant decisions are made intermittently all year, as Fund Advisors desire.
- ♦ Grant awards typically range from \$500-\$7,500.

# Fund for Chester County Capacity Building Grants (Due 9/13)

- ♦ For eligibility in this grant program, nonprofits must be located in & serve Chester County.
- Nonprofits **budgets** must be **\$500,000 or less.**
- The goal of capacity building grants is to strengthen the effectiveness of NPO's serving the region, see page 4 for more details on the areas including:
  - Mission, Vision & Strategy
  - o Governance & Leadership
  - Partnerships & Collaborations
  - Operations & Technology
  - Fundraising, Development & Marketing
- ♦ Proposals submitted between <u>July 1 Sept. 13</u> are eligible for consideration.
- ♦ Grant awards typically range from \$500-\$5,000, with monies distributed by February.

The Salvation Army is one of the world's largest providers of human services to individuals and families in need. We are proud to serve all people in Jesus' name without discrimination. In Chester County, The Salvation Army operates two brick-and-mortar Corps Community Centers in West Chester and Coatesville, as well as an expansive network of volunteer support systems called "Service Extensions." Every zip code in Chester County has a Salvation Army presence that is equipped to serve a wide variety of community needs.

#### **Coatesville Corps Community Center**

669 E. Lincoln Highway, Coatesville, PA 19320 Corps Officers: Lieutenants David & Lilia Soria Services:

- Bread to Blessing: Through donations from various organizations/companies every week, we open our doors every Thursday at 10:30 am - 12:00 pm to anyone in the Coatesville Community for a client-choice supermarket shopping experience. Food varies from cans to fresh vegetables and frozen goods.
- Clothing and Furniture Vouchers: Clothing and furniture vouchers are provided based on need and
  residency in the Coatesville community. They are redeemable in The Salvation Army Thrift store
  in West Chester on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays. This service is available once a year per
  family.
- Emergency Food Boxes (Food Pantry Service): Food insecurity and hunger are still a harsh reality for many struggling families in Coatesville. To ensure local families have enough to eat, The Salvation Army of Coatesville provides emergency food boxes to those in need.
- Prescription Vouchers: Prescription vouchers are provided based on need and residency in the Coatesville community. We do not fill narcotic or controlled substance prescriptions. Our maximum voucher is \$50.00 per person.
- Rental Assistance: Rental assistance is offered to those living in Coatesville and those living in Atglen, Brandamore, Cochranville, Modena, Parkesburg, Pomeroy, Sadsburyville, Steelville,

- Suplee, Thorndale, Wagontown, and Birchrunville. To qualify, individuals must provide photo identification and proof of residency. This assistance is available once per year per household.
- Utility Assistance: We provide assistance with electric, heating oil, water, and gas utility bills. To qualify, individuals must reside in specific zip codes we serve in the region and provide photo identification and proof of residency. This assistance is available once per year per household.
- Summer Meals Program: The Salvation Army of Coatesville provides children ages 5-17 breakfast and lunch every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM. These meals have been delivered to their homes since the pandemic to ensure no children are hungry. The program runs from June- August.

## **West Chester Corps Community Center**

101 E. Market Street, West Chester, PA 19382 Corps Officers: Captains Jesus & Maria Corraliza Services:

- Community Meal Program: The Community Meal program serves dinner six days a week: Sunday through Thursday and Saturdays. Dinner is a hot meal including a main dish, sides, and dessert. Breakfast is served Monday through Thursday at 7:00am.
- Alcoholics Anonymous: AA meetings are held on Wednesdays at 6:00pm. All are welcome to this open meeting and refreshments are provided.
- Rental Assistance: The Salvation Army of West Chester offers rental assistance to those living in West Chester (19380, 19381, 19382 and 19383). To qualify, individuals must provide photo identification and proof of residency. This assistance is available once per year per household.
- Utility Assistance: Through ESFP funding, The Salvation Army of West Chester provides assistance with electric, heating oil, water and gas utility bills. To qualify, individuals must reside in the following zip codes (19380, 19381, 19382, 19342, 19395, 19087, 19312, 19333, 19335, 19301, 19073 and 19319) and provide photo identification and proof of residency. This assistance is available once per year per household.
- Clothing Vouchers: Clothing vouchers are provided based on need and residency in the greater West Chester community. They are redeemable in The Salvation Army Thrift store on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays. This service is available once per person in a six-month period.
- Prescription Vouchers: Prescription vouchers are provided based on need and residency in the greater West Chester community. The maximum voucher is \$50.00 per individual.
- Eyeglasses: With a \$5.00 copay and photo I.D. we connect community members with the West Chester Lions Club and Chester County Opticians to provide eyeglasses. This service is available once every two years.
- Railton House: Railton House is a single room occupancy (SRO) program and serves as a bridge for gentlemen who have graduated from The Salvation Army Adult Rehabilitation program and are transitioning back to independent living. Our maximum capacity is seven men.
- Permanent Housing: Through HUD funding, The Salvation Army of West Chester supports permanent housing for those who meet the program standards. Qualifications for eligible individuals include chronic (documented) homelessness and those already receiving social security or disability income. This service is limited to one person per studio/efficiency unit.

In communities where TSA does not have a Corps Community Center, dedicated volunteers organized as "Service Units" provide emergency financial assistance and basic necessities to families and individuals

facing financial crisis. Service Units in Chester County are located in 37 zip codes and are led by year-round volunteers and seasonal volunteers, providing emergency financial assistance to families and individuals in crisis. This expansive safety network was particularly helpful in assisting those in need throughout Chester County during the recent pandemic.
