GRANT PROPOSAL GUIDELINES

- The Chester County Community Foundation connects people who care with the causes that matter, so their philanthropy makes a difference now & forever.
- We are a collection of Field of Interest & Donor Advised Funds with \$5M + granted annually to nonprofits in Chester County & beyond.
- 99% of our grants are made by our generous Fund Advisors, who make grant decisions all year.

Proposals submitted by nonprofits are considered for 2 types of grants:

Field of Interest & Donor Advised Funds (No Deadline)

- Grants focus on Chester County causes & issues, but are not limited to Chester County.
- Charitable nonprofits working in all fields of interest are considered for grant awards. (I.e. arts, culture, & humanities; education; community improvement; environment; religion; health; & human services)
- ♦ General operating grants are encouraged. Nonprofits should be specific about their mission, goals, & measurable outcomes.
- ♦ Proposals can be submitted <u>anytime all year</u>.
- Grant decisions are made intermittently all year, as Fund Advisors desire.
- ♦ Grant **awards** typically range from \$500-\$7,500.

Fund for Chester County Capacity Building Grants (Due 9/11)

- ♦ For eligibility in this grant program, nonprofits must be located in & serve Chester County.
- ♦ Nonprofits budgets must be \$500,000 or less.
- ♦ The goal of capacity building grants is to strengthen the effectiveness of NPO's serving the region, see page 4 for more details on the areas including:
 - Mission, Vision & Strategy
 - o Governance & Leadership
 - Partnerships & Collaborations
 - Operations & Technology
 - Fundraising, Development & Marketing
- Proposals submitted between <u>July 1 Sept. 11</u> are eligible for consideration.
- ♦ Grant awards typically range from \$500-\$5,000, with monies distributed by February.

Proposal Summary: Research shows us that far too many kids, 1 in 3, are growing up without even one constant, positive adult in their lives and this is a root cause for the amount of poverty and violent crime we are experiencing here in our Greater Philadelphia. With the help if many, we have been

able to grow our organization over the past four years from a handful of mentors working with 400 kids on a \$400,000 budget to now having 18 full-time and professionally trained mentors working with over 3000 kids annually with a \$2,000,000 budget. Due to the tremendous need, we need to keep this organization going and growing.

YMP has also given, so far, eight graduating YMP students the opportunity to attend the trade school, Pennco Tech, at no cost. The distinctiveness is the fact that we serve so many kids, over 3000 kids per year.

2. Funding request

- Description of key initiatives- Our new Continuum for Success is one of our key initiatives
 where we will continue to surround approximately 125 graduating YMP young adults with
 services and mentoring, better assuring their success after high school.
- Specific needs & issues to be addressed We found that even after years of mentoring and kids gaining confidence and work ethic, through YMP's 3G programming, these young adults are still very vulnerable. They lack basic skills such as financial literacy, navigating FASFA applications and higher education opportunities, lacking a network to turn to for help. I am attaching our new Continuum for Success program information with this proposal.
- Why it is important to fund this now Because there is a current need and this need will
 continue due to the fact that schools are not equipped to teach such disciplines nor provide
 such a network to their graduating students.
- How impact & results will be demonstrated This will be easy as we will continue being
 engaged with these young adults and helping them until they have a good paying job, that
 they enjoy, with healthcare & retirement benefits. That's when we will disengage from the
 person(s) but they know they will be able to call on us, if necessary.
