1. Nonprofit's history, goals, key achievements & distinctiveness

The village of Yellow Springs has a rich history spanning over 300 years, playing significant roles in events such as the Philadelphia Campaign of the Revolutionary War, the American Impressionist art movement led by the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, and serving as the filming location for the cult classic film The Blob, among others. Today, Yellow Springs stands as a vital center for local history in northern Chester County, a thriving hub for artists with top-tier exhibitions, highly regarded classes for all ages, and a premier wedding venue.

In the past year, we have made important strides in historic preservation and community engagement. We have recently completed restoration on the last vacant building in the village, transforming a neglected 1800s residence into our first wheelchair-accessible, ADA-compliant art studio, complete with youth programming focused spaces. We also launched new initiatives for veterans and individuals with special needs, offering process-oriented art-making experiences that give traditionally marginalized voices a chance to express themselves freely.

Our new scholarship program now offers opportunities for broader community participation, with 90% need-based, 75% veteran, and 50% merit-based scholarships to remove barriers for those interested in hands-on creativity year-round. In addition, new guided tours and partnerships are drawing fresh visitors of every age, and connecting them with our mission to celebrate art, local history, and the environment.

Much like those before us, we are committed to harnessing the potential of Yellow Springs' 140 acres of opportunity to enrich lives and preserve our shared heritage.

2. Funding request

Description of key initiatives

Historic Yellow Springs seeks funding to develop a new strategic plan that will guide the organization's future growth and sustainability. Since our last plan in 2008, the organization has undergone significant change, including the hiring of Executive Director Tim Compton in 2023, who has strengthened community ties, built a skilled staff, and led a capital campaign that doubled the capacity of our arts programming. This expansion has raised important questions about the organization's long-term focus across its three core mission areas—environment, history, and arts—while also prompting the board to reassess governance, leadership tenure, and the need for fresh perspectives. To ensure continued growth and alignment, we plan to engage Julep Consulting to lead a three-year strategic planning process that will clarify priorities, strengthen board effectiveness, and position Historic Yellow Springs for long-term success as we serve an increasing number of students and community members.

Specific needs & issues to be addressed

The specific needs and issues to be addressed by this funding request focus on the current lack of a strategic plan, and the need for clear organizational vision as Historic Yellow Springs continues to increase their community impact in northern Chester County. The process of developing a strategic plan will help us have a more forward thinking approach as the board, staff, and supporters understand more

clearly the intent for the next three years. This effort will also help to reevaluate board governance and bylaw issues to ensure best practices and sustainability.

Why it is important to fund this now

As a designated Heritage Site in the PA 250 initiative and a key contributor to Chester County's heritage themes, Historic Yellow Springs is poised for a significant increase in attendance and community engagement. Additionally, our newly constructed studio spaces have doubled our capacity, allowing us to serve more students and visitors than ever before. To effectively manage this growth and maximize our impact, we need a clear strategic direction that aligns our goals, programs, and leadership. Investing in a strategic plan now will ensure we are prepared for upcoming events, provide clear expectations for future initiatives, and position us for long-term success and sustainability.

How impact & results will be demonstrated

Results will be demonstrated with the adoption and implementation of a new three year strategic plan in the 2025 calendar year. This new strategic plan will work in tandem with a new campus master plan and ADA access plan to ensure decision making at every level is considering the larger long term implications. This level of forward thinking will result in more proactive planning by the board and staff while better meeting the expressed needs of our community.
