# **GRANT PROPOSAL GUIDELINES**

- The Chester County Community Foundation connects people who care with the causes that matter, so their philanthropy makes a difference now & forever.
- We are a collection of Field of Interest & Donor Advised Funds with \$5M + granted annually to nonprofits in Chester County & beyond.
- 99% of our grants are made by our generous Fund Advisors, who make grant decisions all year.

## Proposals submitted by nonprofits are considered for 2 types of grants:

# Field of Interest & Donor Advised Funds (No Deadline)

- Grants focus on Chester County causes & issues, but are not limited to Chester County.
- Charitable nonprofits working in all fields of interest are considered for grant awards. (I.e. arts, culture, & humanities; education; community improvement; environment; religion; health; & human services)
- General operating grants are encouraged.
   Nonprofits should be specific about their mission, goals, & measurable outcomes.
- ♦ Proposals can be submitted <u>anytime all year</u>.
- Grant decisions are made intermittently all year, as Fund Advisors desire.
- ♦ Grant awards typically range from \$500-\$7,500.

## Fund for Chester County Capacity Building Grants (Due 9/11)

- ♦ For eligibility in this grant program, nonprofits must be located in & serve Chester County.
- ♦ Nonprofits budgets must be \$500,000 or less.
- ♦ The goal of capacity building grants is to strengthen the effectiveness of NPO's serving the region, see page 4 for more details on the areas including:
  - Mission, Vision & Strategy
  - o Governance & Leadership
  - Partnerships & Collaborations
  - Operations & Technology
  - Fundraising, Development & Marketing
- Proposals submitted between <u>July 1 Sept. 11</u> are eligible for consideration.
- ♦ Grant awards typically range from \$500-\$5,000, with monies distributed by February.

### **Proposal Summary:**

Chester County Futures (CCF) is seeking a grant of \$5,000 from the Chester County Community Foundation to support our general operations. We provide under resourced secondary and post-secondary students in Southern Chester County with resources and supports to achieve success in college, in their career and in life through our Passport and Steps 4 Success programs.

# II. CHESTER COUNTY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION GRANT PROPOSAL NARRATIVE

#### 1. Nonprofit's history, goals, key achievements & distinctiveness

Founded in 1996 and with over 29 years of service to our students, families, and community, Chester County Futures (CCF) provides access to important resources, opportunities, and scholarships in support of their future.

CCF's Passport and Steps 4 Success programs work with underserved students to succeed in high school, post-secondary education, and life through a comprehensive blend of academic, life, and social supports. Your funding will support our mission and advance our core goal of empowering students to best define the trajectory of their futures.

Chester County Futures has been recognized for its contributions to the community through the delivery of our programs. In 2022 we were awarded The Corporate Citizenship Award by the Western Chester County Chamber of Commerce, in 2020 the Philadelphia Eagles named us a Community Red Zone Organization, and in 2019 we received the Philadelphia 76ers Game Changer Award, and in 2023 CCF was awarded 2nd place in the "Let's Talk Allyship" presentation for their cohort.

Notably, two (2) members of the Passport program's graduating class of 2025 received full ride scholarships to the post-secondary institution of their choice.

#### 2. Funding request

#### Description of key initiatives

Chester County Futures' Passport and Steps 4 Success programs work with under resourced students in the Kennett, Oxford, Phoenixville, Coatesville Area High School Districts to offer academic and social and emotional supports, resources, scholarships, and experiential learning experiences to position them for succeed in high school, college or technical school, in their early career, and in life. Additionally, CCF staff facilitates SAT prep, college tours, visits to local corporations, application assistance, and completion of FAFSA forms.

Steps 4 Success is a supportive resource network for students and their families embarking on their post-secondary journey. Steps program students have access to academic, professional, and social guidance as they navigate a new college landscape. Steps students may also receive CCF scholarship awards.

#### Specific needs & issues to be addressed

Since Covid the number of students enrolling into a post-secondary bound school or program has dropped by 8%. On average the school districts we serve have a bachelor's degree rate of 33.95%, 22.15% lower than the Chester County average of 56.1%. Bachelor's degree holders earn 31 percent more than those with an associate's degree and 84 percent more than those with just a high school diploma. A bachelor's degree is worth \$2.8 million on average over a lifetime. CCF supports high school students to define their post-secondary path to increase post-secondary enrollment. US Census and PA Department of Education.

#### • Why it is important to fund this now

CCF, as an organization, is working to adapt to the changing educational needs in high school and in college. It is critical that CCF help support the students, community and schools to continue to strengthen the future of students and their families. With a bachelor's degree being worth \$2.8 million on average over a lifetime, it is imperative that CCF supports high school students to define their post-secondary path to increase post-secondary enrollment. US Census and PA Department of Education. This elevates the student, their families, and their communities enabling them to attain a secure financial future.

#### How impact & results will be demonstrated

Our programming team works closely with school administrators in the Chester County schools we serve to track information that best demonstrates how CCF positions students for success and informs the post-secondary trajectory. Participant surveys from our students, along with parent feedback, help us as we examine program goals and objectives.

CCF measures the following goals to gage our impact:

- 100% of students participate in career and post-secondary experiential learning activities;
- 100% of Grade 9-12 students participate in ongoing one-on-one advising sessions; and For the 2024-2025 school year, CCF achieved these program goals.

Additionally, 100% of students in the Passport program engaged in wellness and self-care workshops.
