GRANT PROPOSAL GUIDELINES

- The Chester County Community Foundation connects people who care with the causes that matter,
 so their philanthropy makes a difference now & forever.
- We are a collection of Field of Interest & Donor Advised Funds with \$5M + granted annually to nonprofits in Chester County & beyond.
- 99% of our grants are made by our generous Fund Advisors, who make grant decisions all year.

Proposals submitted by nonprofits are considered for 2 types of grants:

Field of Interest & Donor Advised Funds (No Deadline)

- Grants focus on Chester County causes & issues, but are not limited to Chester County.
- Charitable nonprofits working in all fields of interest are considered for grant awards. (I.e. arts, culture, & humanities; education; community improvement; environment; religion; health; & human services)
- General operating grants are encouraged.
 Nonprofits should be specific about their mission, goals, & measurable outcomes.
- ♦ Proposals can be submitted <u>anytime all year</u>.
- Grant decisions are made intermittently all year, as Fund Advisors desire.
- ♦ Grant awards typically range from \$1,000-\$7,500.

Fund for Chester County Capacity Building Grants (Due 9/10)

- ♦ For eligibility in this grant program, nonprofits must be located in & serve only Chester County.
- ♦ Nonprofits **budgets** must be **\$500,000 or less.**
- The goal of capacity building grants is to strengthen the effectiveness of NPO's serving the region, see page 4 for more details on the areas including:
 - Mission, Vision & Strategy
 - Governance & Leadership
 - Partnerships & Collaborations
 - Operations & Technology
 - Fundraising, Development & Marketing
- Proposals submitted between <u>July 1 Sept. 10</u> are eligible for consideration.
- ♦ Grant awards typically range from \$1,000-\$5,000,

- Proposals are considered "complete" when CCCF has confirmed receipt of the Grant Proposal Summary Sheet, Narrative & Attachments.

- Per IRS Regulations, applicants <u>must be</u> charitable, tax exempt organizations with 501(c)(3) certification & <u>cannot</u> be individuals.

Other key achievements are the amount of support ASP students recieve from all areas of WCU faculty, staff, and other WCU students' mentors and peers. We work diligently to make our ASP students comfortable in their new college environment by offering one on one tutoring and supportive services. We work across college disciplines to provide a strong dynamic program. 30% of WCU Faculty and staff, including President Bernotsky is a first-generation student. As President Bernosky has stated repeatedly, "WCU wants to educate the 99% of those who want higher education".

Academic Success Program (ASP)
West Chester University of Pennsylvania

Program Overview

The Academic Success Program (ASP) at West Chester University (WCU) is dedicated to empowering academically promising yet underprepared students, primarily from underserved communities across Chester County and the surrounding region. Through targeted instruction, personalized mentoring, tutoring, and comprehensive support services, ASP prepares students for successful college experiences, improving retention and graduation rates among participants.

Mission and Community Impact

ASP significantly contributes to educational equity and social mobility within Chester County by supporting first-generation college students and those from economically disadvantaged backgrounds. Our comprehensive program has consistently demonstrated positive impacts, including increased retention, higher GPAs, and greater graduation rates, ultimately fostering community prosperity through education.

Program Components and Key Initiatives

- **Summer Bridge Program:** Intensive skill-building in reading, writing and math prior to students' first semester.
- Academic Support: Year-round tutoring and mentoring.
- Personalized Advising: Regular student check-ins and progress monitoring.
- Mental Health and Wellness and Community Engagement: Wellness coaching and cohortbuilding activities provided by doctoral students in our PsyD program
- **Retention Initiatives:** A faculty member in ASP serves as retention specialist to support upper-level students through graduation
- **Experiential Learning:** Students in ASP are provided opportunities to participate in career exploration, research projects and other out-of-class learning opportunities

Funding Request

West Chester University respectfully requests consideration for a grant of \$25,000 from the Chester County Community Foundation Donor Advised Funds.

This funding will directly support:

- hiring and training of qualified and eligible peer mentors and tutors from the local community.
- Expanded mental health and wellness and advising services.
- Outreach initiatives to local underserved high schools within Chester County.
- Educational materials for economically disadvantaged students

- Emergency funding for students struggling to pay tuition, room/board and other fees
- Financial support to assist students with transportation costs associated with internships/co-ops or other experiential learning opportunities

Expected Outcomes

With support from the Chester County Community Foundation, ASP anticipates:

- Increasing student retention rates by 10%.
- Achieving an average participant GPA of 2.5 or higher after their first semester.
- Enhancing college graduation rates among participants by at least 15%.
- Strengthening community partnerships and increasing educational access for Chester County residents.
