Purpose of the Operating Grant

This \$10,000 operating grant will help sustain and strengthen The Creative Club's essential operations and programming in 2025–2026.

Funds will be used to:

- Maintain the Coatesville studio space, including rent, utilities, and insurance;
- Upgrade creative and digital equipment to support workshops in digital art, photography, and multimedia production;
- Support staff and administrative functions necessary for program coordination and community outreach; and
- Enhance marketing and engagement efforts to reach more residents across Chester County.

This investment ensures that The Creative Club remains a vibrant, accessible hub for creative learning and innovation.

Community Need

Coatesville continues to face socioeconomic challenges that limit access to safe, affordable, and enriching afterschool and community spaces. Many residents—particularly youth—lack exposure to creative technology, mentorship, and programs that encourage self-expression and skill development.

The Creative Club responds directly to this need by offering a safe, supportive environment where participants can explore art, storytelling, and digital media as tools for empowerment, healing, and workforce readiness.

Our programs not only foster creativity but also help participants build confidence, develop career-aligned skills, and connect to positive community networks.

- Cultivate partnerships with local schools, nonprofits, and artists to expand program impact.

This grant will ensure that Chester County residents continue to benefit from innovative, inclusive programming that uplifts individuals and strengthens community identity.

Evaluation & Impact Measurement

Success will be measured through:

- Attendance tracking and participation demographics:
- Participant surveys measuring confidence, creativity, and sense of belonging;
- Workshop evaluations and qualitative feedback from families and partners; and
- Public engagement through exhibitions and social media analytics.

An annual impact report will summarize outcomes, lessons learned, and community stories to demonstrate the ongoing value of CCCF's investment.

Program Description

The Creative Club in Coatesville provides year-round creative arts programming, including:

- Visual Arts Workshops: Painting, drawing, sculpture, and photography
- Digital Media & Design Labs: Digital art, music production, and video storytelling
- Writing & Performance Sessions: Poetry, spoken word, and creative writing
- Community Exhibitions: Annual showcases where youth present their work publicly
- Mentorship Opportunities: Local artists and creative professionals guiding youth development

This grant will allow us to expand our reach, enhance our facilities, and offer more opportunities for youth to create, collaborate, and share their voices.
