The Colonial Theatre will stage a Parlour Reading Series production of CATO, A Tragedy by Joseph Addison in July 2026 to honor the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence. The play - George Washington's favorite - was performed by his soldiers at Valley Forge, right down the road from Phoenixville, and it powerfully reflects the founding ideals of resisting tyranny and pursuing liberty.

Funding will support local performers and cover essential production expenses, including props, marketing, a director stipend, and administrative time, with total costs estimated at \$1,000–\$1,500. This program will engage local audiences, students, and community members by demonstrating how art has shaped our nation's early identity and continues to inform civic understanding today.

The Colonial Theatre will collaborate with local artists and community partners to present a meaningful, historically grounded cultural event that reconnects our region with its Revolutionary-era roots.
